In 2025, we gifted **nine refurbished computers** to students who might otherwise have struggled without access to essential technology. That brings our three-year total to **22 computers distributed across Miami, Shelby, and Darke counties**. Behind each number is a student in Piqua, Troy, Sidney, Greenville, or elsewhere in our region — each story a reminder that opportunity expands when technology is within reach.

We are proud to say that this year's impact was made possible not only by your generosity, but also by the partnerships we continue to cultivate. The Piqua Community Foundation's \$2,000 grant supported more than six computers, Hartzell's earlier \$900 grant helped fund three, and LexisNexis has sustained us with three refurbished computers annually. Add to that the ongoing \$1,000 annual contributions from Snap2IT Accounting and the steady flow of equipment from Edison State and private donors, and you see the power of collaboration at work.

Our environmentally sustainable approach remains a cornerstone of our identity. Every refurbished computer represents not just a student empowered, but also electronic waste diverted from landfills. We are proud to stand at the intersection of education and sustainability, proving that responsible reuse can drive meaningful change.

Diversity and inclusion continue to guide our culture. Our volunteers and leadership reflect the communities we serve, and we remain intentional in creating programs that welcome students of all backgrounds. We are committed to equipping our team with the tools to serve compassionately and effectively, ensuring that every student feels seen and supported.

Looking ahead, we are setting our sights on gifting **20 computers annually**. It's an ambitious goal, but one we believe is achievable with your continued partnership. Looking ahead, we're committed to reaching our annual goal of 20 computers, expanding our reach, and deepening our connections to serve more students across Miami, Shelby, and Darke counties.

Operational Performance

Computer Distribution Program

The Computer Distribution Program remains the heartbeat of TeKconnect's mission. In 2025, nine refurbished computers were distributed to college students, nearly doubling the prior year's impact and bringing our three-year total to 22 computers gifted. Each system extended access to essential digital tools that support educational advancement and career readiness.

Sustained demand continues to highlight the ongoing need for technology resources among low-income learners. Streamlined processes and careful inventory stewardship ensured timely, efficient delivery to students navigating barriers to access. Recipient feedback underscores the transformative effect of access — students report greater confidence in coursework, smoother transitions into internships, and stronger preparation for the workforce.

Partnerships with Educational Institutions

Collaboration continues to play a pivotal role in identifying and supporting students with limited digital access. In 2025, TeKconnect strengthened its partnership with Edison State Community College, which facilitated targeted outreach and smoother distribution. We also initiated promising outreach to a second institution, marking a step forward in expanding our campus presence.

Financial Performance

Revenue and Funding

TeKonnnect, Inc. has maintained a strong financial position, with total revenue of \$ 22,067.80. Our funding sources include donations from individuals, corporate partnerships, and grants. We have seen a steady increase in donations, reflecting growing support for our mission.

Expenses

Our total expenses for the year amounted to \$15,941.00. The primary areas of expenditure include program costs, administrative expenses, and fundraising activities. We have implemented cost-saving measures to ensure that the majority of our funds are directed towards our programs and services.

Cash Net Assets

Our cash net assets for the year are \$6,126.80, reflecting our commitment to fiscal responsibility and sustainability. This surplus will be reinvested into our programs to support future growth and impact.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION & ANALYSIS (MD&A)

Strategic Initiatives

Expansion of Programs

We are committed to expanding our programs to reach more students. In 2025, TeKonnnect gifted nine refurbished computers, nearly doubling the prior year's impact and bringing our three-year total to 22 computers distributed. Looking ahead, our goal is to increase distribution to 20 computers annually, ensuring more, low-income college students have the tools they need to succeed.

Strengthening Partnerships

Partnerships remain the backbone of our mission. In 2025, we strengthened our collaboration with Edison State Community College and began outreach to a second institution, laying the groundwork for broader campus presence. We also continued to benefit from LexisNexis's annual donation of three refurbished computers and Snap2IT Accounting's \$1,000 annual contribution. Looking forward, we aim to expand partnerships with additional colleges, community organizations, and tech companies to secure more resources and reach more students.

Environmental Sustainability

Refurbishment & Reuse

Environmental sustainability is a core value at TeKonnnect. Every refurbished computer represents less e-waste and more opportunity. In 2025, we continued our commitment to responsible reuse, extending the life cycle of donated equipment by refurbishing what we can and placing it directly into the hands of students.

Responsible Recycling

When components are obsolete, unneeded, or unusable, we responsibly recycle them through local residential recycling services. While we don't operate a formal e-waste program, this practical approach ensures that materials are diverted from landfills whenever possible.

Energy-Conscious Practices

With no employees and a lean volunteer model, our footprint is naturally small. We remain mindful of energy use in our workshop and encourage volunteers to adopt low-consumption practices.

Commentary

Our sustainability efforts are simple but impactful: refurbish what we can, recycle what we can't, and operate with care. This approach reduces waste, extends the life of technology, and aligns our mission with responsible stewardship.

Equity and Inclusion

Fostering equity and inclusion remains a foundational priority across both organizational culture and program design. In 2025, we refined recruitment strategies and strengthened leadership representation to ensure our programs reflect the varied identities and lived experiences of the communities we serve. A commitment to belonging, respect, and empowerment continues to guide our efforts, ensuring that every student feels seen, supported, and equipped to thrive.

Challenges and Opportunities

Challenges

Managing the logistics of distributing computers to a growing student population presents ongoing complexity. However, increased equipment donations, LexisNexis's annual refurbished units, and an efficient refurbishment process — where unusable components are resold — have stabilized funding and mitigated financial concerns. The focus remains on optimizing systems to meet rising demand while maintaining program quality.

Opportunities

Heightened awareness of digital literacy and the persistent digital divide present a timely opportunity for TeKonnnect. Expanding programs and strengthening partnerships will allow for broader impact and increased student support across academic and career pathways.

2025 marked a period of meaningful growth and measurable progress for TeKonnnect, Inc. Milestones in bridging the digital divide and expanding access for low-income college students underscore our deepening impact. With stable financial footing and an expanding network of community partners, the path ahead is one of continued innovation and growth.
